

2012-2013 Biomass Tax Credit Certificate of Efficiency

The previous efficient biomass heating appliances tax credit that expired on December 31, 2011 was reinstated by the American Taxpayer Relief Act of 2012 (H.R. 8). The bill includes a "tax extender" for Internal Revenue Service Section 25C which provides a tax credit for biomass burning stoves that meet specific requirements. A 10 percent tax credit of up to \$300 on a qualifying unit purchased between January 1, 2012 and December 31, 2013.
